## WHAT EVERYONE LOVES ABOUT CHEVY CHASE DC

Nestled against Rock Creek Park on the east and separated from its Maryland counterpart by Western Avenue, Chevy Chase, D.C. was first born as a residential streetcar suburb of the nation's capital. Since it was founded in 1890, the then-remote farmland slowly transformed into the bustling community it is today, creating a literal "corner" on DC's real estate on the market.

The community's major commercial artery, Connecticut Avenue, has maintained its historic charm over the decades and is popular with residents despite (and perhaps because) of its lack of national chain stores and suburban malls. Instead, smaller, locally owned companies flank its sidewalks, offering visitors and long-time community partners alike a different approach to doing business. These storefronts include Catch Can, Child's Play, and Fishery Seafood. There are also mainstays, such as Magruder's Supermarket, a small boutique grocery store that was established in 1875, and the Avalon Theatre, which first opened in 1923 as a silent film house.

#### **CHEVY CHASE DC REAL ESTATE**

Rated as an "A+ community" by Niche.com, Chevy Chase, D.C. is home to 20,461 residents who rank their neighborhood as one of the best places to live in the District. Featuring highly-rated schools and happily-reviewed coffee shops and restaurants, this corner of the nation's capital thrives with plenty of green space, historic charm, and just enough distance from the hustle and bustle of downtown.



For the most part, homes in this neck of the woods are charming single-family Colonials, bungalows, and craftsman-style homes built in the 1900's on a variety of lot sizes and gardens. A concentrated number of condos line themselves up along Connecticut Ave.

#### **CHEVY CHASE DC SCHOOLS**

Chevy Chase DC is home to two highly-rated public elementary schools: Lafayette and Murch. Both schools have an "A" rating on Niche.com for academics and teachers, and both schools have also scored highly in English and math on the STAR framework.

Murch is also LEED Gold Certified with a newly modernized building that offers indoor and outdoor learning. Almost half of its teachers have been teaching for over ten years.



Lafayette offers blended learning, interscholastic sports, and arts integration. Over half of its teachers have more than ten years of experience and one teacher recently won the DC Public School Teacher of the Year Award.

Other reputable public schools in the area include Alice Deal Middle School and Woodrow Wilson High School. Private schools include Blessed Sacrament School and St. John's College High School.

Chevy Chase DC also has a handful of great nursery schools, including <u>Broad Branch</u> <u>Children's House</u>, which promotes learning using the Montessori method, a method that encourages the natural development of the whole child from birth through maturity.

There's also <u>Chevy Chase Presbyterian Church</u> and <u>Temple Sinai Nursery School</u> that offer play-based curriculums to support children in their learning and growing.

- Connecticut Avenue Retail Strip
   This strip bolsters the neighborhood's main section of cafes, restaurants, boutiques, and other businesses. It's walkable to many homes.
- Friendship Heights Commercial Strip
   Very close by is the Friendship Heights shopping strip. You'll find high-end retailers here such as Whole Foods, Saks Fifth Avenue, J. Crew, Bloomingdales, Neiman Marcus, Lord & Taylor, Cheesecake Factory, and Clyde's.

There's a variety of activities in Chevy Chase, DC that are a short walk or bike ride away.

# Lafayette Park & Recreation Center

In 1928, the District of Columbia purchased 12 acres of farmland to build the Lafayette School. Some of these belonged to Mr. Horace Jones, whose original farmhouse still stands on Quesada Street.

After World War II, victory gardens were added to the landscape and its history, and



today the 9-acre Lafayette Park is one of the sparkling gems in the Chevy Chase DC community, complete with playgrounds, paths, flowers, and shady places for picnics.

It features multiple playgrounds for various age groups, as well as a baseball field, tennis courts, a basketball court, a running track, and a renovated recreation center.

# Lafayette Park Farmers Market

Provides a variety of farm to table type fruits, veggies and baked goods.

#### Broad Branch Market

An independent, community-focused market in Chevy Chase DC that is a huge hub of the neighborhood. Its where children can come before and after school for bagels, snacks, or treats. For parents, it offers prepared food, wine, and warm baguettes. During the warmer weather months, there are tables in front and it's a popular gathering area for eating lunch.



## DC Health Coaches

A locally-owned and operated business started by three alumni of the Lafayette, Deal and Wilson school track teams, DC Health Coaches occupies the basement level of the Broad Branch Market and offers personal training, small group training, and bootcamps.

## Rock Creek Park

At over twice the size of Central Park in New York City, Rock Creek Park has 1,754 acres of naturally forested and beautifully curated grounds, including a golf course, the Rock Creek Park Horse Center, a tennis stadium, the Carter Barron Amphitheatre, and several miles of inter-connected hiking and equestrian trails.

## Chevy Chase Neighborhood Library

This library is a great place to go when you need a place to study or relax between errands.

# Chevy Chase Community Center

Offers three stories of activities for the young to the old, including a dance studio, fencing, pottery/art studio, woodworking, dark room, auditorium, and more.

## Livingston Park

Livingston Park, informally called the "41st Street Park," is home to the Chevy Chase Recreation Center, a dog park, a splash park, playgrounds, tennis and basketball courts, and baseball fields.

#### **CHEVY CHASE DC TRANSPORTATION**

Chevy Chase DC might have a tucked-away feel, but it is relatively easy and fast to get to downtown DC. It's a straight shot to downtown from Connecticut Avenue and there is a Metro in nearby Friendship Heights, Van Ness and Tenleytown.

There is also the Rock Creek and Potomac Parkway, which is commonly referred to as the Rock Creek Parkway, and it runs next to the Potomac River and Rock Creek. If you're going to be sitting in traffic, it's a beautiful place to be!

Several bus lines come through Connecticut Avenue and Military Road. Residents or guests might also choose to utilize Zipcar, which is available throughout the neighborhood.
